WHO ARE THE SONS OF PERICLES?

The Sons of Pericles are an international brotherhood dedicated to the preservation of Hellenism. In addition, the Order espouses philanthropy, civic responsibility, athletics, education and individual excellence. As an international fraternity, the Sons of Pericles expands across the United States, Canada, Greece, and other parts of Europe. Our worldwide chapters form the base of our organization and strive to positively impact their local communities. The organization is divided by state(s) and province(s) into Districts. The Supreme Lodge is the international governing body of the Sons of Pericles and its primary purpose is to ensure the success and growth of the local chapters. Open to males 14-27, the Sons of Pericles is the Junior Order of AHEPA and has as its counterpart the Maids of Athena, open to women ages 14-27.

OUR MISSION & OBJECTIVES

Three short words cannot do justice to the breadth and depth of value that the Sons of Pericles offers. The motto "Heritage, Service, Brotherhood" comes the closest to categorizing and summarizing our significant impact.

HERITAGE

Our predecessors' initial purpose was to assimilate Hellenic-American immigrants into American culture. Assimilation came at a high cost, with the expectation that integrating into American culture was synonymous to losing our Hellenic identity. After fighting for freedom of expression and identity for decades, our needs have evolved and our current mission builds on our past: we strive today to preserve the Hellenic history and culture of our ancestors. We promote the values of Hellenism and attempt to impart our culture on young Hellenes and Philhellenes alike, all while uniting the Hellenic Diaspora, with the goal of strengthening its attachment to and ability to aid Greece.

SERVICE

We often put Hellenism and Philanthropy into two separate categories, but our impact as a service organization embodies the reality that community service is a rooted value of Hellenism. $\Phi_i\lambda\alpha\nu\theta\rho\omega\pi$ ia (Philanthropy) and $\phi_i\lambda\alpha\xi\nu$ ia (Philoxenia) literally translate to "love of mankind" and "friend to the stranger," respectively. The deeper definition of these terms entails the never-ending effort to serve our communities and remain hospitable to all people, regardless of background.

We contribute to that effort by donating every year to a National Project, in addition to donating and serving our communities in the form of disaster relief, environmental cleanup, aiding abuse victims, aiding orphans and disadvantaged children, and much more.

BROTHERHOOD

We strive to develop and strengthen a fraternal bond with our members, young Hellenes and philhellenes of like minds and values. Through athletics, social events, cultural programs, etc., we take the term "brother" seriously and pride ourselves on the ability to foster lifelong relationships between our members and the members of the other orders in the AHEPA family.

HISTORY OF THE ORDER

OUR ORIGINS

In 1922, the Order of AHEPA was founded in Atlanta, GA. The South in those days, as most of us know, was not a society of equals. Along with African-Americans, Catholics, Jews and Greeks were increasingly becoming the targets of the Ku Klux Klan. After the hanging of a young Greek-American by the Klan, a group of Greek-American men in Atlanta formed the Order of AHEPA. Consequently, AHEPA's original cause was to fight racism and to assist Greeks from Greece to immigrate and assimilate into the North American mainstream. The AHEPA membership was made up of adult Greek males.

In the years that followed, eleven young Greek males, with a spirit that equaled that of their ancestors, conceived the idea of and organized the Sons of Pericles. The purpose was to compliment the AHEPA and serve as a vehicle to keep the young Greeks, living in North America, together so they would never lose touch with the Greek culture. The Sons of Pericles were started in 1926 by a group of Manchester, New Hampshire Ahepans. The founder was Dr. Alexander Cambadhis. He helped the fledging new youth group with their dealings with other organizations as well as with the Order of AHEPA. His goal, and the goal of the Sons of Pericles is to promote Hellenism to the youth and to keep the fire of our Motherland burning for generations to come. Together with the aid of some members of the Order of AHEPA from the Manchester, NH Chapter, these young men were the first members of the Order and are known collectively as The Mother Lodge of the Sons of Pericles.

The first chapter named itself Queen City Chapter #1. Its first officers were installed on February 3, 1926. Within a year, the first Sons of Pericles National Convention was held in Lowell, MA with 14 Chapters in the fraternity. In 1928, in Detroit, MI, the Sons were officially recognized as the Junior Order of AHEPA. In 1932 at the National Convention in Akron, OH, the Order expanded its jurisdiction into Montreal, Canada, thereby making it the first international Greek Youth Organization in the world.

OUR PAST ACHIEVEMENTS

NATIONAL PROJECTS AND PHILANTHROPY

In 1938, an excursion to Greece gave the Sons the inspiration for the first of many national projects. A visit to Missolonghi, Greece, inspired the dedication of a monument to the heroes of the war of Greek Independence. After approval of both houses of the U.S. congress, the monument was presented as an expression of goodwill from America to Greece. In 1971, the Sons of Pericles and Maids of Athena, (junior order of the Daughters of Penelope) undertook the same national project for the first time, raising over \$30,000 for multiple sclerosis. In 1985, the Sons of Pericles raised \$10,000 in order to bring the Greek Special Olympics team to the international games in Utah. Since then, the Sons of Pericles have raised well over a million dollars for various charities and special events.

We proudly continue this commitment to helping those that are less fortunate, and to fight for causes that promote Hellenism. In 1996, the Sons of Pericles helped raise over \$10,000 for a commemorative statue that was presented at the 1996 Olympic games in Atlanta. This statue represented the past, present, and future of the Olympic games. The dedication ceremony took place a few months before the Olympic games and was attended by local and state officials as well as His Eminence Archbishop lakovos. During the Olympic games, when a small pipe bomb was detonated, this immense statue helped shield tourists from debris.

The Sons of Pericles National Project is something that brings together members of our organization from all over the world. Each year, delegates to our Supreme Convention vote on proposals that come from our members and decide what the Order will promote as its National Project in the upcoming year. In more recent years, the Sons of Pericles have helped raise funds for Cooley's Anemia Research, Colon Cancer Research, The American Heart Association, The Friedreich's Ataxia Research Alliance, The Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation, St. Jude's Children's Hospital, The Cyprus Children's Fund, The Smile of the Child (Χαμόγελο του Παιδιού), the JED Foundation, the AHEPA Service Dogs for Warriors program, Ronald McDonald House – Greek Division, the Children's Miracle Network, Boys and Girls Club of America, and many more.

CIVIC RESPONSIBILITY

During the war years (1942-1946), the Sons of Pericles suspended operations. However, they did not remain idle. They assisted the members of the AHEPA in the selling of us war bonds. The order of AHEPA, with the Sons assistance, sold the most war bonds during the war than any other organization. In 1947, the sons resumed normal operations. In 1982, the Sons and Maids, in continued cooperation, held the first biannual youth salute. The first honoree was U.S. Senator Paul Sarbanes, with Sergeant Shriver (1984), lke Pappas (1986), and U.S. Congressman George W. Gekas (1988) to follow. In 1990 Chris Economides was awarded the honor, and in 2001 Christos Cotsakos, Chairman and CEO of E* trade.

ATHLETICS

In an effort to keep all of its members active and athletic, the Sons of Pericles undertook an athletic program, with local, regional and national tournaments. One of its most popular sports has always been basketball. Numerous local tournaments were merged to form regional ones. The first national basketball tournament was held in 1940 with Pittsburgh, PA #112 taking top honors. For many years, there were four regional basketball tournaments.

Each are dedicated to the members in the West, Midwest, Northeast, and Southeast. Supreme President Greg J. Kalamaras (1988 - 1989) helped restructure the way each regional is hosted.

Currently, the Sons of Pericles host at least two basketball tournaments a year, and have successfully co-hosted a coed volleyball tournament with the Maids of Athena for many years. These tournaments do not include district tournaments, and other seasonal sports that our Chapters may participate in. We hope to bring back the regional structure of the past in upcoming years.

EDUCATION

The Sons of Pericles, in the past, established scholarships in the memory of our Brothers who suffered untimely deaths. While scholarships in memory of Brothers Stergios B. Milonas, George N. Kaloudis, and John Katsimatides were once established by the organization, they were ultimately absorbed by the AHEPA Educational Foundation and paid out as a Sons of Pericles Scholarship.

The Sons of Pericles Supreme Lodge currently issues three scholarships a year:

The Sons of Pericles National Scholarship
The Sons of Pericles AHEPA Senior Living Scholarship
The Sons of Pericles Philotimo Scholarship

The Sons of Pericles continue to promote education and raise money to support and expand their current scholarship program.

OUR ORIGIN STORY

Who was Pericles?



Pericles (circa 495-429 BC), was an Athenian statesman, so influential in Athenian history that the period of his power is called the Age of Pericles. His father was the army commander Xanthippus, victor over the Persians at Mycale in 479 BC. In Athenian politics Pericles sought to enable all citizens to take an active part in the government. Payment of citizens for their services to the state was introduced, and members of the council were chosen by lot from the entire body of Athenians. His foreign policy was expansionist. Under the Delian League, established in defense against the Persians, the Athenians created a great naval empire and embraced, as equal or subject allies, nearly all the larger islands of the Aegean Sea and many cities to the north. When the aristocratic leader Cimon, who favored friendship with Sparta, was ostracized (banished) in 461 BC, Pericles became the undisputed leader of Athens, serving for the following 15 years.

With the great wealth that came into the treasury from the Delian League, Pericles restored the temples destroyed by the Persians and built many new structures, the most splendid of which was the Parthenon on the Acropolis. This program provided employment for the poorer citizens and made Athens the most magnificent city of the ancient world.

Under Pericles' leadership Athens became a great center of literature and art. The supremacy of Athens aroused the jealousy of the other Greek city-states, especially of Sparta, long the bitter rival of Athens. The cities feared the imperialistic schemes of Pericles and sought to overthrow Athenian domination. In 431 BC the Peloponnesian War began. Pericles summoned the country residents of Attica within the walls of Athens and allowed the Peloponnesian army to ravage the country districts. The following year a plague broke out in the overcrowded city. The people, exposed to suffering and death, resented Pericles. He was deposed from office, tried, and fined for misuse of public funds, but he was soon reinstated. He died shortly thereafter.

From the ideals espoused by Pericles and Classical Athens, this fraternity was formed.

OUR FRATERNITY LETTERS



The two Greek letters, Ypsilon and Pi are the letters that represent the initials of the Fraternity. They stand for two Ancient Greek words: "Υιες" and "Περικλέους." - "Υιες" comes from the Ancient Greek word "ο Υιος" which means "son." Υιες is the plural "sons," with the article oi it means "The Sons" - "Περικλέους" comes from the Ancient Greek word "ο Περικλης," which is the name Pericles. "Περικλέους" is a form of the noun that denotes possession, along with the article του (which translates to "of"). So, the Name of the Fraternity, οι Υιες του Περικλέους translates directly from the Ancient Greek into the English phrase "The Sons of Pericles."

THE SONS OF PERICLES CREED

A Son is always COURTEOUS, RESPECTFUL AND CONSIDERATE in his daily association with others.

A Son learns to think independently, yet he knows how to act in cooperation with his fellows, for the mutual benefit of all. He practices both, as a useful citizen of his community and nation.

A Son strives to be devoted and loving to his parents; his ambition is to be worthy of their sacrifices for him.

A Son keeps within himself a strong, burning fire of patriotism—deep, unquenchable love for this Country's liberty and institutions of freedom and a constant faith in her unending progress.

A Son faces the world as a firm believer and follower of his own religion, Christianity. He acknowledges this belief and expresses his convictions by regular attendance at Church.

A Son recognizes his firm obligation to stimulate the love, admiration and practice of Hellenic culture, tradition and ideals.

A Son is cognizant of, and constant to, his Oath and Obligation as a member of this fraternity; it is his sacred moral trust, his beacon light to a clean, reverent and useful life.

A Son believes in all these principles, even as he believes in himself, he will always maintain and uphold these ideals – precepts of a worthwhile life.

To these obligations and ideals, we herewith pledge our faith, our word, and our honor.

OUR MISSION

(As found in Article II of the Constitution of the Sons of Pericles)

- (a) To promote and instill the spirit of a national patriotism; allegiance to the flag; support to the Constitution; obedience to the laws and reverence for the history and traditions of the Unites States of America, Canada, the Bahamas, the Commonwealth of Australia and Greece.
- (b) To stimulate love and admiration of the Hellenic culture, traditions and ideas; to promote throughout the world, and especially the United States and Canada, a better and more comprehensive understanding of the Hellenic people; to encourage the study of Hellenic letters, arts, and sciences and the preservation and teaching of the Hellenic language.
- (c) To develop character by promoting in every manner possible a high standard of ethics and good fellowship amongst its members. To develop the spirit of human understanding, mutual benevolence, helpfulness and to stimulate and encourage education and to point out to its members the beauties of sacrifice and the deformities of selfishness.
- (d) To champion the causes of education, and to make possible for its members the full enjoyment of education facilities.
- (e) To further in its memberships the ideals of obedience and respect towards parents and elders.
- (f) To prepare its members for admission into the Order of AHEPA and to assist the chapter of the AHEPA to carry out the aims and purposes of the Senior Fraternity.

MEMBERSHIP AND GOALS

The age of the members of the Sons of Pericles is between 14 and 27. In order to start a Chapter, you must be sponsored by a local AHEPA Chapter. The minimum number of members needed to start a Chapter is eight, although areas with less than eight members can become "Sons-at-Large."

The entire AHEPA domain has been divided into Districts, of which the Sons of Pericles are a part of. A District is made up of multiple Chapters in the same region. In order to be considered an active District, there must be at least three active Sons of Pericles Chapters, and those Chapters must be able to sustain membership if one or two of their officers serves on a District Lodge.

The total number of members over the years has hovered around the 1500 mark. In 1989, the Sons of Pericles reached 2,248 members, the highest total since World War II. Times have changed and the Sons of Pericles now have competition from multiple Hellenic and Hellenic-American organizations, but we strive to work with these organizations to help perpetuate a successful future for all of us.

The Goals of the Organization are fairly simple: to promote Hellenism, as well as to promote philanthropy, civic responsibility, athletics, education and individual excellence.

HELLENISM

"There are two types of people in this world: Greeks and people who wish they were Greek." Michael Constantine, the father in My Big Fat Greek Wedding, couldn't have said it better. The one thing that makes the Sons of Pericles unique among all other fraternal organizations is that we are all Hellenic or Philhellenes. We share a common background, culture and language that no other fraternal order has.

The Sons of Pericles represents the lifeline of Hellenism in America. In order to introduce Hellenic Ideals to a new generation of young men not just in America, but Canada, Greece, and all over Europe, the Sons of Pericles must continue to thrive into this millennium. This is where you (the member) come into play.

COMMUNICATION

Communication is one of the most important keys to success in any organization. The Sons of Pericles conceived our National newsletter, The Periclean in an effort to keep the growing membership informed of all events, announcements, and Sons of Pericles news.

On September 5, 2000, the Sons of Pericles entered the new millennium with our very own website, the purpose of which is to continue to serve and inform the membership with the newest technology. Since then, as technology has advanced, the Sons of Pericles have expanded our reach electronically. We are active on multiple social media platforms and have adapted The Periclean to become an e-newsletter that is distributed via email not just to our membership, but to members of the AHEPA Family who also want to keep abreast of what is going on in our order.

HONORS & INDIVIDUAL EXCELLENCE

Every year, the Supreme Lodge of the Sons of Pericles distributes awards to the deserving members, Chapters, and Districts. These are awarded at every Annual National Convention, which is held in conjunction with the Order of AHEPA. Awards include Son of the Year, Chapter of the Year, Most Improved Chapter, Chapter President of the Year, District of the Year, District Governor of the Year. In 1988, in an effort to honor those who have helped the Order and under the leadership of Supreme President George W. loannidis, the Sons of Pericles started a Wall of Honor. Every year, the Supreme Lodge is allowed to induct a group of inductees, called a "class."

THE STRUCTURE OF THE SONS OF PERICLES

Like any other organization, the Sons of Pericles has its own unique structure. It is modeled from the AHEPA structure. Locally, a there are chapters. Chapters are usually located in connection with a city, a Greek Orthodox Church and an AHEPA Chapter. Each state or region has many chapters that are near each other, either by being in the same state or neighboring states. The entire AHEPA domain is divided into 28 different geographic regions, called Districts. The Districts are governed by an international body called the Supreme Lodge. The Supreme Lodge is directly elected by delegates at the Supreme Convention. They are responsible for ensuring the success of the fraternity throughout all Districts.




Figure 1: Structure of the Sons of Pericles

THE CHAPTER

The duty of the Chapter Officers is three-fold:

DUTY to the members – the Chapter Officers must keep the members involved, interested in the Fraternity and focus the Chapter's goals to be in line with the ideals of Hellenism and the Sons of Pericles.

DUTY to the District – the Chapter Officers must keep the Chapter known to the District in terms of records, events and the like. The duty extends to participation in District Events.

DUTY to the Supreme Lodge – the Chapter officers must keep the Chapter known to the Supreme Lodge in the same as the District. The duty also extends to participation in the Supreme Convention and the National Project.

HOW TO RUN A CHAPTER MEETING

There are two aspects to every well-run chapter meeting: organization and order

Organization: ALL chapter meetings should adhere to the following agenda:

- 2. Recitation of the Sons of Pericles Creed
- 3. Roll Call of Officers
- 4. Reading of Minutes of Previous Meeting
- 5. Treasurer's Report
- 6. Read and vote on applications
- 7. Read Communications
- 8. Old Business
- 9. New Business
- 10. Good of the Order
- 11. Closing Prayer

Order: ALL meetings are run better if there is order within the meeting room. This means that the meeting should be run by the President (the chairperson) and the members should all follow Parliamentary Procedure, either as dictated by "Robert's Rules of Order." which can be found online at www.rulesonline.com.

EXECUTIVE RESPONSIBILITIES

Chapter President Article XVIII

Section 1

The president shall preside at all meetings of the chapter and shall perform other duties as prescribed by the chapter. He shall enforce the Constitution, By-Laws, Rules and Regulations of the Fraternity; preserve order at all times during the meetings and shall be responsible for the observance of the Fraternity's purposes and ideals by the members of the chapter.

Monthly Responsibilities of President

Every Month:

Remind chapter secretary to announce monthly meeting 5 days in advance Prepare agenda for monthly meeting Complete Chapter update form and send to your Supreme Lodge liaison

May/June

Complete State of the Chapter form and send to your Supreme Lodge liaison Send Chapter Election Result Form to your Supreme Lodge liaison and HQ Attend District Convention (if applicable)

Elect and Report Delegates & Alternates for Supreme Convention to HQ Have those members attending Supreme Convention pre-register before the deadline set by HQ to take advantage of lower prices.

July

Complete State of the Chapter form and send to your Supreme Lodge liaison Attend AHEPA Family Supreme Convention

August

Meet with Chapter officers and advisor to discuss chapter goals for the year

September

Complete State of the Chapter form and send to your Supreme Lodge liaison Attend Governor's Conference in Washington, DC!

December

Prepare and send Dues & Obligations to AHEPA Headquarters (1909 Q Street NW, Suite 500, Washington, DC 20009) by December 31st

To Note:

All forms should be emailed to your Supreme Lodge liaison, SOP advisor, and National Headquarters All Chapter Forms can be found on-line at: www.sonsofpericles.org

Your Chapter Update Form is due on the *last Saturday* of every month.

EXECUTIVE RESPONSIBILITIES

Chapter Vice President

Article XVIII

Section 2

The Vice-President shall assist the President in conducting the business of the chapter and shall assume the duties of the President in the absence or disqualification of the latter. The President will be in charge of membership for the chapter.

Responsibilities of Vice President

Actively seek potential members

Plan rush activities for new members twice a year (November and February)

Have an account of membership which includes the roster of members

Collect membership applications to send in to Supreme Lodge

Fill out dues remittance form to send to Supreme Lodge

Make sure all members UNDER 18 are submitted to HQ to be credited for their yearly free dues.

Communicate with Treasurer and Secretary to have an accurate account of members Have a report each month for your meeting which includes:

Number of Current members

Number of Members initiated

Number of Members lost

Suggestions for new members

To Note:

All forms should be emailed to your Supreme Lodge liaison, SOP advisor, and National Headquarters (stephanie@ahepa.org)

Member Roster shall be updated after each initiation and shall contain Name, Email, Phone Number, Address, Birthday and Age. Updated Roster should be sent to executive board as well as the remaining members.

All new member applications need to be sent to HQ following initiation. Dues must accompany applications for those members over 18.

EXECUTIVE RESPONSIBILITIES

Chapter Secretary

Article XVIII

Section 3

The secretary shall conduct all correspondence of the chapter under the direction of the President, keep a record of proceedings of the chapter, its membership and such other matters in the interest in the chapter. He shall collect all dues and fees and turn over all dues and fees to the Treasurer. He shall submit a periodic report on the progress of his chapter to the District Governor and the Supreme Lodge liaison in charge of the district which his chapter exists.

Responsibilities of Secretary

Complete minutes and email to membership

Send reminders of meetings and important deadlines and announcements via email, social media, and text

Meeting reminders must be made at least five (5) days in advance

Monthly communicating with Supreme Lodge Liaison and provide chapter updates Update any Chapter social media pages and websites

Provide President with communication update from Supreme Headquarters, Supreme Lodge, District Lodge, and other Auxiliaries

EXECUTIVE RESPONSIBILITIES

Chapter Treasurer

Article XVIII

Section 4

The treasurer is responsible for all money that comes into the chapter, depositing it and giving reports at every meeting about the financial status of the chapter.

Responsibilities of Treasurer

Upon taking office:

If you are a new or newly reactivated chapter, contact Stephanie at HQ (stephanie@ahepa.org) for help obtaining an EIN for your chapter and any other materials you might need to open a bank account. A good idea is to decide what bank the Chapter wants to use and see what they require to open an account. Complete this before you go to the bank in person to open the account.

If you already have an account established, go to the bank with the Chapter President and Advisor to change signature authority on the Chapter's bank account.

Throughout the year:

Give an accurate account of funds at chapter meetings

Complete monthly treasurer's report (record according to the bank statement)
Attach treasurer's worksheet to chapter minutes and put them in file copy binder
All monthly account activities must be recorded in the Chapter Account Book
(deposits, withdrawals, checks, fees, etc.)

Go to the bank with Chapter President and Advisor to change the signing authority on the SOP Bank Account once new officers take office

Before leaving office:

Provide incoming treasurer with a budget for the coming year

To Note:

All checks must have three (3) signatures: President, Treasurer and Advisor

Treasurer must provide members with receipts for dues payment and any chapter reimbursement Reimbursements will only occur with receipts

DUES PAYMENT & DUAL MEMBERSHIP

Along with the Vice President, the Chapter Treasurer is responsible for making sure all dues collected by members are remitted to National Headquarters. Though the hard deadline for dues remittance is December 31st, in order to avoid any issues, **dues should be sent in as soon as they are received**.

Members over age 18 are automatically made members of the Order of AHEPA as well. They will be dual members until they are too old to be a member of the Sons of Pericles. These members must pay whatever the current amount of AHEPA national dues are in order to remain members in good standing of each organization. Currently, National Dues for the Sons of Pericles are \$50 for members over 18 and \$20 for members under 18.

When remitting money to HQ, checks should be made out to **Sons of Pericles Supreme Lodge**. Once funds are received at headquarters, dues will be processed for the SOP and AHEPA. If checks are not sent directly to the SOP, there is no guarantee that SOP membership will be credited.

Members are also able to pay online via sonsofpericles.org.

For AHEPA Chapters:

Any dual members appearing on your roster should not be paid through AHEPA. When you submit payment to AHEPA Membership, simply write "SOP" in the box so the AHEPA membership director knows that the member you are referencing will be paid by the Sons of Pericles.

If you are paying dues for the SOP Chapter associated with your AHEPA Chapter, checks MUST be made out to **Sons of Pericles Supreme Lodge** and remitted to Sons of Pericles at HQ. If not, the dues will not be processed in the SOP database and membership numbers will be skewed.

If you see names of SOP members on your chapter roster that you do not recognize, please contact stephanie@ahepa.org to make sure they were placed in the correct chapter. SOP dual members are either filtered into the AHEPA Chapter they have instructed HQ to place them in or made National members.

To Note:

All checks must be made out to SONS OF PERICLES SUPREME LODGE

All checks sent to HQ must be accompanied by a Dues Remittance Form, if not, it will be returned All forms should be emailed to your Supreme Lodge liaison, SOP advisor, and National Headquarters (stephanie@ahepa.org)

FORMS

In order for your chapter to remain in good standing, certain forms need to be submitted to the Supreme Lodge and Headquarters every year in order for records to be up to date. The primary forms necessary are as follows:

Membership Application Form

The membership application form needs to be filled out by all new members upon initiation into the Sons of Pericles. A copy should be sent to National Headquarters as soon as it is received. If the member is over 18, dues payment must be included with the application form.

Dues Remittance Form

Must be filled out and sent to National Headquarters with every dues payment in order to make sure that dues money is properly credited.

Election Return Form

Must be filled as soon as elections and installations for new officers are held. Copies need to go to your Supreme Lodge liaison and to National Headquarters.

Chapter Petition for Charter or Reactivation

When starting or reactivating a Chapter of the Sons of Pericles, a petition must be filled out and sent to National Headquarters. The petition should be signed by all members of the Sons of Pericles invested in starting or restarting the Chapter.

General Remittance Form

Should accompany any donations or paraphernalia orders when being sent to National Headquarters.
